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1. INTRODUCTION

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1.1 BACKGROUND

In January 1997, the Agency for Health Care Policy and Research (AHCPR) contracted with the Center for Health Policy Studies (CHPS) to create an inventory of clinical, population, and system performance measures used by the federal government. The project was to be completed in three phases: Phase I-workplan development, Phase II--data collection/testing and analysis, and Phase III-data collection, analysis, and reporting. Phase III, the current phase of the project, began in September 1997.

The first phase was a planning phase, which resulted a **workplan** for the second and third phases. During Phase II, CHPS tested the data collection tools and classification scheme. During Phase III, major modifications were made to the data collection parameters based on feedback from the Phase II pilot test agencies and the Performance Measures Workgroup.

The scope of the inventory project changed substantially during Phase III. Perhaps the most significant cause of the delays in the project and the changes in scope was the dissolution of the Performance Measures Workgroup and the subsequent interest in the inventory project by the Quality Interagency Coordinating (QuIC) Task Force. As a result, the Performance Measure Inventory contains a only subset of CONQUEST 2.0 data elements, with an additional element to identify the type of measure (clinical, population, or system).

1.2 REPORT OVERVIEW

This report is organized in three chapters. Chapter two describes the methodology used to collect the measures and identifies the federal agencies that participated in the project. Chapter three describes the Performance Measure Inventory database-the primary deliverable of this project. The appendices include the data collection forms, reports from the database, and instructions for using the runtime version of the Performance Measure Inventory database.

2. METHODOLOGY

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2.1 INTRODUCTION

The methodology for collecting the data on performance measures used by the federal government changed somewhat between Phase II and Phase III, based largely on feedback from the pilot test agencies and on the priorities of the Quality Interagency Coordinating (QuIC) Task Force.

While the initial plan was to use the CONQUEST data elements, adjusted to accommodate population and system measures, feedback from the agencies suggested that a “pared down” data set be collected for the inventory. Appendix A presents the data collection form developed to collect the measures. The data elements included in the revised data set were:

- Measure Name
- Subset Name
- Measure Set Name
- Description of Numerator
- Description of Denominator
- Measure Type
- Applicable Age Range
- Measure Designed to Assess Care Given in These Locations
- Current/Planned Use
- Source/Follow-up Contact

This subset of data elements was collected with the understanding that it could be expanded at a later date and uploaded into CONQUEST if desired.

2.2 SOURCES OF PERFORMANCE MEASURES

AHCPR supplied the Center for Health Policy Studies (CHPS) with a list of members of the QuIC subcommittee on performance measurement. CHPS contacted each of the members and asked that they identify a contact person within their agency who would be responsible for coordinating the measure collection effort. Table 2-1 identifies the agencies that were approached to participate in the inventory project and whether or not they submitted any measures. Appendix B includes the letter that was sent to the QuIC members asking for their participation in this project.

CHPS worked with each of the contacts to identify and collect the measures used by their agency. As stated in the letter to the QuIC members, the agencies could either fill out the Performance Measure Survey form (Appendix A) or submit measure documentation from which CHPS staff could glean the information. Most agencies chose to submit documentation rather than completing the form.

2.3 CODING AND VERIFYING MEASURES

‘CHPS coded the measures based on the documentation submitted by the agencies. In many instances, the information about the development of the measures was incomplete. For instance, in some cases, the documentation submitted consisted of summary reports based on the statistics collected from the measures. Using this information, CHPS staff recreated the numerator and the denominator, age ranges, and other information. In addition, CHPS had to classify measures by type, assigning them to either clinical, population, or system categories. If a measure was classified as a system measure, it had to be further classified in one of the following categories: availability (temporal) of provider, claims processing, customer service, member response, network maintenance, satisfaction, or utilization management process/results.’

To help ensure the accuracy of the information in the database, we sent each agency contact a set of completed Performance Measure Survey forms (Appendix A) and asked that they validate the data elements for each measure. The final database reflects all changes received from the agency contacts.

A total of 1,430 measures were collected and entered into the database,

3. PERFORMANCE MEASURE INVENTORY PROGRAM

The Performance Measure Inventory database is compiled in a runtime version of Microsoft Access. "Runtime" means that users who do not have Microsoft Access on their computers can still use the Performance Measure Inventory database. Instructions for installing and using the Performance Measure Inventory database are included in Appendix C.

In addition to allowing users to enter measures directly into the database, the Inventory also includes options to import measure information from CONQUEST 2.0 or from a Microsoft Excel spreadsheet. This will provide added flexibility in the future in terms of updating and expanding the Inventory, if desired.

There are three standard reports that can be viewed or printed from the Performance Measure Inventory database. These include:

- Measure Summary presents measures sorted by agency and set name.
- Measure Inventory presents the measures sorted by agency, measure type, and set name with a count of the measures in each grouping. This report also includes the name, phone, and fax of the contact person.
- Measure Form presents each performance measure in the Performance Measure Survey form. (Blank forms can also be printed.)

Appendix D includes a copy of each of these reports.

The Agency for Health Care Policy and Research (AHCPR) has contracted for the compilation of an inventory of all system-wide performance measures (clinical, population, and health system) developed, in use, or under development by Agencies and Departments within the Federal Government. This inventory will be used by the Measures Workgroup of the Quality Interagency Coordinating (QuIC) Task Force to complete its work.

The QuIC was formed in response to a Presidential memo earlier this year to the Director of the Office of Personnel Management and the Secretaries of Defense, Labor, Health and Human Services, and Veterans Affairs directing the Federal Government to “do a better job of collaborating within and across the Federal Government to most efficiently and effectively ensure that we achieve the national goal of improving quality and health outcomes.” It is your Agency/Department’s representative on the QuIC (fill in name) who provided your name as the contact for the measures data collection effort.

The Center for Health Policy Studies (CHPS) is the organization contracted by AHCPR to perform this work CHPS staff will collect all necessary written materials from departments and agencies and enter the data into the database used to create the inventory. If departments and agencies prefer to do their own coding and data entry, they will be provided with a diskette, a program, and instructions for completing the work. Once the draft inventory is completed, it will be circulated back to you for review, comment, and correction. All additions or corrections to the database that you provide to CHPS will be completed by the CHPS contractor staff in order to minimize the work burden placed on you.

This is a quick turn-around project. Consequently we hope that by mid-January 1999, you can provide to the contractor most, if not all, of the initial information requested.

The inventory information represents a small subset of the data elements that appear in AHCPR’s CONQUEST database of clinical performance measures. Thus, several hundred clinical measures already in CONQUEST can be easily transferred to the inventory by the CHPS

staff. Population measures, such as many of those that appear in *Healthy People 2000*, will also be listed in the inventory. System performance measures, such as those dealing with satisfaction, access, and administrative functions (e.g., claims processing and payment), will also be included in the inventory. Once completed, the inventory will be provided to the Measures Workgroup, the full membership of the QuIC, and the Federal staff who contributed to its development.

Please refer to the attachment for detailed information on what the CHPS contractor will need from you to complete the project.

What We Will Need from You to Complete the *Inventory of Performance Measures* For the QuIC Measures Workgroup

1. What Measures Will Be Included in the Performance Measures Inventory ?

The measures of greatest interest are those that are under development, in existence, or in use on a system-wide basis. Samples of regional and local applications may also be considered if representatives can provide the necessary information/data on those measures. All performance measures that are applied to health care delivery systems, plans, facilities, or practitioners will be included in the inventory. These include clinical performance measures that might be applied to a particular physician, to all patients treated for a given condition in a specific hospital, or all patients enrolled in a particular health plan treated for a specific condition.

Clinical Performance Measures

A **clinical performance measure** relates to the performance of an accountable provider or plan, and deals with a specific clinical procedure, process, or outcome. Examples include the C-section rate for deliveries in a specific hospital, the proportion of diabetics seen in a particular clinic who receive a retinal exam during a particular period of time, the proportion of children under three years of age enrolled in a health plan who have had all recommended immunizations, and so forth.

Population Performance Measures

If there is no accountable provider or plan, just a general health care system or geographic area population, then a clinical procedure, process, or outcome will be classified as a population **performance measure**. Examples of population measures include the infant mortality rate for the State of Georgia, the proportion of the U.S. female population between 50 and 65 years of age who have had a PAP smear within the prior 12 months, or the incidence rate of measles among elementary school children in Los Angeles during 1998.

System Performance Measures

For this inventory, performance measures that do not address clinical procedures, processes, or outcomes are classified as system **performance measures**. System performance measures can be subgrouped as follows:

- Availability of provider(s)
- Claims processing (accuracy, timeliness)
- Customer service (telephone answering response time, response time to requests, resolution of complaints, data accuracy)
- Member response (enrollment/disenrollment rates, elective changes in primary care provider selection)
- Network maintenance (provider turnover, credentialing)
- Satisfaction (both member and provider)

Utilization management (UM) process/results (denials/appeals, UM decisions consistent with guidelines, utilization rates by level of care, timeliness of reviews, communications of UM decisions)

Because the system performance measures represent a residual category, it may be necessary to create additional subgroups once all data for the inventory have been collected.

Agencies/departments are urged to submit all performance measures that apply to a health system, plan, or provider, even if a measure does not seem to fit within one of the subgroups as currently described.

2. What Do We Need from You?

We will need a list of measures with a contact person(s) and phone number. For each measure, we will need the following information:

Information needed to uniquely identify the measure

- Measure name and, if part of a set of measures, the set name
- Category of performance measures (clinical, population, or system)
- Description of the numerator and denominator

Limited information about the application of the measure

- Type of measure
- Applicable age/sex groupings and care settings

Current/planned use of measure and whether still being developed or ready for use

• Source/follow-up contact

3. What Will CHPS Do?

CHPS staff will contact each person and arrange to collect the documentation needed for each measure and measure set. CHPS staff will code that information and enter it into the database used to create the inventory of measures. They may also contact Agency and Department staff for further information and clarification.

4. What Will Happen With the Inventory?

The inventory is being created for the QuIC so that its Measures Workgroup will have full knowledge of the clinical, population, and system performance measures and measure sets under development or already in use by the different Agencies and Departments within the Federal Government. The inventory will also be provided to all those in the Federal Agencies and Departments who contributed to it.

5. How Can the Inventory be Used?

The inventory can be used to:

- Facilitate the work of the QuIC to fulfill its mandate to improve cooperation by Federal agencies on the development and utilization of quality measurement mechanisms for public sector programs, including promoting standardization for comparability of measurement.

- Support the QuIC's work to enhance efforts to develop user-friendly information for both the consumer and business purchasers that facilitates meaningful comparisons of quality performances of plans, facilities, and practitioners.
- Serve as a resource in the QuIC's efforts to coordinate Federal program's quality reporting and compliance requirements to reduce administrative burdens on private entities who administer, oversee, or participate in the Nation's Federal health programs.

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1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 BACKGROUND

In January 1997, the Agency for Health Care Policy and Research (AHCPR) contracted with the Center for Health Policy Studies (CHPS) to create an inventory of clinical, population, and system performance measures used by the federal government. The project was to be completed in three phases: Phase I-workplan development, Phase II-data collection/testing and analysis, and Phase III-data collection, analysis, and reporting. Phase III, the current phase of the project, began in September 1997. This database is the result of Phase III of the project.

The database is structured similarly to CONQUEST 2.0, although significantly fewer data elements are included in the Inventory. The database was compiled in a “runtime” version of Microsoft Access, which means that even those users who do not have Access can run the database.

The sections and chapters that follow provide instructions for installing the Inventory program and describe each function in detail. Descriptions of the functions are accompanied by screen shots from the Inventory database.

1.2 INSTALLING THE PERFORMANCE MEASURE INVENTORY DATABASE

The Performance Measure Inventory database may be installed using the setup program provided. If the software was delivered on diskettes, the setup program is located on disk 1 of 9. If delivered on CD-ROM, the setup program is located in the root directory of the CD-ROM disk. Use the setup program to install the software and database (setup.exe).

In Windows 95:

- Select the START menu item on the task bar.
- Then select the RUN menu item.
- Then in the “Run” dialog box enter the following:
D:\Setup.exe
This assumes a CD-ROM assigned as drive D:
or
A:\Setup.exe
This assumes a diskette drive assigned as drive A:
- Follow the instructions/prompts of the setup program.
- Type of installation is “typical

In Windows 3.11:

- Select the FILE menu item in Program Manager.
- Select the RUN menu item.
- Then in the “Run” dialog box enter the following:
D:\Setup.exe
This assumes a CD-ROM assigned as drive D:
or
A:\Setup.exe
This assumes a diskette drive assigned as drive A:
- Follow the instructions/prompts of the setup program.
- Type of installation is “typical”.


Depending on the speed of your computer and media provided, it may take approximately 10 minutes to install the complete Performance Measure Inventory.

1.3 OVERVIEW OF THE PERFORMANCE MEASURE INVENTORY DATABASE

The Performance Measure Directory main page presents the following functions:

- **List Performance Measures**—lists all of the performance measures with selected data elements;
- **Edit Performance Measures**—shows the data entry forms with all data elements for each measure, allows viewing and editing;
- **Performance Measure Reports**—previews and prints selected reports;
- **Import CONQUEST 2.0 Data**—imports CONQUEST data into the database;
- **Import Spreadsheets**—imports data from Microsoft Excel spreadsheets;
- **Setup**—shows the person responsible for the overall inventory; and
- **Exit**—closes the program.

To choose one of these features, select the box in front of it.



2. LIST PERFORMANCE MEASURES

List Performance Measures shows all of the performance measures and selected data elements. The data elements are:



- Set name,
- Subset name,
- Type,
- Planned use,
- Agency,
- Lower age,
- Lower age units,
- Upper age,
- Upper age units, and
- Department.

There are buttons for accessing the edit, print, filter/search, and exit functions as well.

3. EDIT PERFORMANCE MEASURES

Edit Performance Measures allows the user to view and edit all data elements for the performance measures. This function also allows new measures to be added. Data elements for each measure are shown on four “pages” that can be accessed by selecting either the arrow keys around the word “page” or the tabs at the top of the pages. Pages are titled Name and Criteria, Type and Age, Location and Use, and Source and Contact.



The Name and Criteria page has the following data elements:

- Measure Code (Unique Identification Number),
- Measure Name,
- Measure Set Name,
- Measure Subset Name, and
- Description of the numerator and denominator.

The Type and Age page has the following data elements:

- Measure Type and
- Applicable Age Range.

The Location and Use page has the following data elements:

- Location for Measure Use and
- Current/Planned Use.

The Source and Contact page has source and follow information:

- Agency,
- Department,
- Unit,
- Program,
- Contact person's
Name,
Address,
Phone number,
Fax number, and
E-mail address.

On every page, a Browse button allows you to return to the List Performance Measures feature. To return to the Performance Measure Directory select the Close button. The arrows around the word “record” allow for scrolling from measure to measure.

3.1 ADDING NEW MEASURES

To add a new measure, select the button in front of Edit Performance Measures. At the bottom of the screen are small buttons for quickly moving to the beginning and end of the record set. It also shows the current record number, as well as the total number of records in the set. Selecting these buttons will cause the following:

- Line and left arrow (|◀) – moves to the first record of the set,
- Left arrow (◀) – moves to the previous record in the set,
- Right arrow (▶) – moves to the next record in the set,
- Right arrow and line (▶|) – moves to the last record in the set, and
- Right arrow and star (▶*) – moves to an empty record.

To add a new measure, select the right arrow and box button to bring up an empty. The first thing that must be entered is the measure code. This is an eight character, alpha-numeric code of your choice. It must be unique. Currently, groups of measures have been given a two to four letter code and then consecutive numbers to assist with identification of measure sets. For example, all Health People 2000 measures have codes that begin HPT, all Bureau of

Federal Prison measures begin with BFP, and a number of small sets or single measures have codes that begin with MISC. If you enter a measure code that is already in use, an error message will appear, and you will have to change the code before continuing.

To move to the next data element, press enter or select a data field. After the measure name is entered, the name will appear at the top of the screen on every page. To change pages, select the tabs at the top of the pages or select the arrow buttons around the word “page” at the bottom of the screen.

Data elements have a limited number of characters. When the data element is full, it will not allow anything else to be entered into that field. There are two exceptions to this. The description of denominator and the description of numerator will allow entry of large numbers of characters (>250). The Table 3-1 on the next page presents the maximum field size for each data element.

The Type and Age page has check boxes. The boxes remain unchecked until selected. A drop down box is used for age unit elements. Select the arrow button and choose the applicable unit from the drop down box.

The Location and Use page has two data elements. “Location for measure use” allows multiple boxes to be checked. Selecting a checked box removes the check. If “other” is chosen, a field is available for specification.

3.2 DELETING A MEASURE

Users can delete a record from either the List Performance Measures or the Edit Performance Measure functions.

In the List Performance Measures function, select the measure to be deleted. In the Edit Performance Measure function, you must be at the measure you wish to delete. Then select Edit/Delete record on the main menu. A warning that you will not be able to undo the deletion will appear. You will have the option of continuing or stopping the deletion. Stopping the deletion will return the record to its place. Remember if you delete a record, you cannot undo it. You will have to re-enter the information if you change your mind.


3.3.1.1 Text/Keyword Search From Advance Filter/Sort screen select Text/Keyword Search and select the Next button. This brings up the screen shown on the following page. This search function only looks at the name, numerator, and denominator fields. Type the text you wish to search for in the field. Select a search option: all the words in the text, any of the words in the text, or the text exactly as it is. Select the Set Filter button.



To remove the filter select View and then Remove Filter/Sort.




3.3.1.2 Single Field Search and Advanced Sorting To complete a single field search, choose Single Field Search and Advanced Sorting from Advance Filter/Sort screen and select the Next button. The following screen appears:



To create the filter, select the field you are going to filter from the drop down box in the Field field. This box contains all fields. Next, select an operator from the Operator field. An operator is how you want the data compared; choices are similar (LIKE), equal (=), between (< >), smaller than (>), smaller than or equal to (>=), greater than (<), and greater than or equal to (<=). Finally, specify the value to be compared or filtered for. The "*" is a wild card that can be used to represent any character or number of characters. Note that items that have checks are considered yes/no answers. Select the Set Filter button to complete the filter. The filtered records are shown in the List Performance Measures Function.

To clear the filter, select the Clear Filter button. Users may either exit the function or sort the filtered measures. To exit the filter/sort function, select the Exit button. To sort, choose the Sort tab.


3.3.1.3 Multi-Field Search To perform a multi-field search, select Multi-Field Search for the Advanced Filter/Sort screen and select the Next button. This brings up a screen similar to the Edit Performance Measures Screen. The difference is that all fields are blank.



In the field you wish to search, enter the text. The “*” is a wild card that can be used to represent any character or number of characters. All check boxes and drop down boxes are available for searching. Next, select how the data is to match the performance measures: either Any Part Of Field, the Whole Field (will match exactly), or Start of Field. Select the Set Filter button.


The filtered records are shown in the List Performance Measures Function. Once there if you choose the Filter/Sort button, you will return to this screen where additional data can be filtered. 3.3.2.1 Text/Keyword Search For an example of a Text/Keyword search, find all measures dealing with smoking. Select Text Keyword Search from the Advanced Filter/Sort screen. Enter “quit smoking” in the empty field and select search on all words. This is shown on the next page.




3.3.2.2 Single Field Search and Advanced Sorting For example, to see all measure names that begin with Youth, select Single Field Search and Advanced Sorting from the Advanced Filter/Sort screen. Then select the Next button. Select Measure Name from the field list. Select like as the operator. Next type “youth*” in the value line and select the Set Filter button. (Remember, “*” is a wildcard that will ensure that all measures beginning with “youth,” regardless of what follows, will be selected.)

3.3.2.3 Multi-Field Search For example, to look at all system – customer service measures that are in use or on going. Select Multi-Field Search from the Advanced Filter/Sort screen. Select next. From the Type and Age page select Customer Service. On the Location and Use page select Part of a Currently On-Going or Currently Used Measuring System. Select the Match as Whole Field and then the Set Filter button.





3.4 FINDING A PERFORMANCE MEASURE


Finding a performance measure can be done in either the List Performance Measure function or the Edit Performance Measure function. First, select the data element field to be searched. Next, choose View from the tool bar, then Find from the View menu.



Type the desired word or phrase in the “Find What” section. This can be a partial word or phrase. Choose the appropriate condition—whole field, any part of field, or start of field—from the drop down box in the Match section. Select Find First or Find Next. The cursor will appear in the measure that contains the word or phrase entered. Find Next will bring up additional measures containing the word or phrase.

4. PERFORMANCE MEASURE REPORTS

Performance Measure Reports generates a number of reports that can be either viewed on the screen or printed.



The Measure Summary report shows the measure names by agency and set.

The Measure Inventory report shows the measures by agency, measure type, measure set, contact, and name. In addition, this report gives a count of measures by agency, measure type, and measure set.

The Measure Update Form report prints out all data elements for each measure. The Blank Update Form report is a Measure Update report with all data elements blank.

In addition, all reports can be filtered. This allows either a certain set of measures, all measures, or one measure to be printed in any of the report formats.

The Preview button prepares the report and shows it on the screen. The Print button prints the report. The Exit button returns you to the Performance Measure Directory. The View button shows how the measures filtered, if filter is in use.

4.1 PRINTING A REPORT


The Performance Measure Reports function can be accessed from the Performance Measure Directory or by the Print reports button in the List Performance Measures function. Select the type of report you wish to print. You must choose whether the report will include all records or one record. If the filter function is in use, the screen will automatically select Use Current Filter Settings.

The Preview button allows the report to be viewed on the screen. To close the display of the report, select the X button on the right hand side of the window with the report showing. The Print button sends the report to the printer.

It is important to note that if you have a filtered set of measures in the List Performance Measures function and use the Reports button, the measures will remain filtered for your reports unless you choose print all measures. You can select the View button to see how the measures are filtered. If the measures are not filtered, the Use Current Filter Selection and View buttons will not be active (bold).

5. IMPORT CONQUEST 2.0 DATA


The Import CONQUEST 2.0 Data function allows users to add data from the CONQUEST database to the Performance Measure Inventory database. Use the Browse button to show where the file is located and the file name.



It is important to note that if a measure from the CONQUEST database is imported a second time any changes made in the Inventory database **will** be lost.

6. IMPORT SPREADSHEETS

Import Spreadsheets allows Microsoft Excel spread sheets to be imported into the database. The spreadsheet must have the appropriate titles in order for this function to work correctly. Titles are listed in Table 6- 1. Remember that the data elements are size limited. Use the Browse button to show where the file is located and the file name.

A default contact can be selected.


