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From the Perspective of the Person

- Difficulty recognizing symptoms and receiving diagnosis
- Loss of job
- Change in sense of purpose
- Loss of independence
- · Loss of medical insurance
- Changes in communication
- Changes in ability to perform everyday tasks
- Change in judgement

"For me Alzheimer's feels like I've fallen into a pit. I can see everyone, but I don't know how to get back to them."


Person with younger onset Alzheimer's Disease

- Isolation
- Change in roles
- Change in mood and personality
- Increase in anxiety
- Increase in depression

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Challenges for the Person

- · Diagnosis can take a long time
- Exit from work can be difficult
- Difficulty navigating disability insurance and other benefits
- · Difficulty finding purpose and roles in family and groups
- · Difficult finding others living with younger onset

From the Perspective of the Family

- Isolation
- Changes in Communication
- Change in mood and personality

Spouse of someone with younger onset Alzheimer's




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From the Perspective of the Family


