MEETINGS OF EXPERTS ON ADVANCED DEMENTIA

In accordance with The National Plan to Address Alzheimer's Disease: 2013 Update, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services contracted with the Institute of Medicine (IOM) to convene experts on advanced dementia. The experts will discuss and make suggestions about how providers, including primary care physicians and hospitals, should address patient-centered goals of care and care-related issues, such as infection management, feeding and nutrition problems, falls and injury prevention, transitional care and hospitalizations, and communication. The experts may also discuss models to improve care for persons with advanced dementia.

Fourteen individuals have been selected to participate in the first meeting of experts on advanced dementia, which will be held in Washington, DC on January 28, 2014. The 14 individuals are listed below.
