## ADVISORY COUNCIL MEETING ANNOUNCEMENT

The next meeting of the Advisory Council on Alzheimer's Research, Care, and Services will be held on Monday, January 13, 2025, from 9:00 am to 4:30 pm EST. The meeting will be a hybrid of in-person and virtual participation. The meeting will be held at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Room 800, Hubert H. During the meeting, the Advisory Council will hear updates from federal agencies on activities during the last quarter and from panels organized by the risk reduction and long-term services and supports subcommittees. Presenters will discuss dementia risk reduction strategies, experiences of people living with dementia, and different dementia care programs from across the country.
