## C. Empowering Patients with Chronic Diseases to Make Decisions About Their Health Care

**Question 3:** What types of digital health tools can be effective in empowering patients with chronic diseases to make decisions about their health care?

- a. How can patients with chronic diseases be empowered to make healthy choices about nutrition and other factors that affect their health?
- b. What are the most effective approaches for empowering patients with multiple chronic diseases to help improve quality, outcomes, and total cost of care (TCOC)?
- c. What types of outcomes might be realized from successfully empowering patients with chronic diseases?
