System Changes in California's Dual Demonstration: The Dementia Cal MediConnect Project

Screening and Diagnosis

- 10 have a trigger question for Cognitive Impairment in Health Risk Assessment
- · 6 have adopted a validated screening tool and 3 integrated results into their EHR
- 5 have a protocol to refer members for a diagnostic evaluation if screen is positive

Caregiver Identification, Assessment, and Involvement

- · 9 report documentation of caregivers
- 4 plans report engaging caregivers in care planning and Interdisciplinary Care Teams
- 2 adopted validated measure of caregiver stress and strain and integrated into EHR
- · 6 offered respite as an optional benefit
- · 6 plans offer or arrange for caregiver education
