

ADVISORY COUNCIL MEETING ANNOUNCEMENT

The next meeting of the Advisory Council on Alzheimer's Research, Care, and Services will be held on Monday, April 29, 2013 from 9:00am to 5:00pm EDT. The meeting will be held at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), 200 Independence Avenue, S.W., Room 800, Washington, D.C. 20201, and webcast live on <http://www.hhs.gov/live>.

The Advisory Council will hear presentations from international partners on their efforts to address Alzheimer's disease. There will also be a presentation on the priorities set during the May 2012 research summit and the milestones for achieving the 2025 goal. The federal partners will provide an update on the progress of implementing the National Plan to Address Alzheimer's Disease, and will discuss highlights of the 2013 National Plan Update.
