RE: Request for Correction of Information – FDA Patient Safety News Alert  
“Preventing Bleeding with Vacuum-Assisted Wound Closure”

Dear Mr. Benke:

This letter is an interim response to your letter date May 15, 2006, (received May 23, 2006) in which you request correction pursuant to Section 515(a) of the Treasury and General Government Appropriations Act for Fiscal Year 2001, Pub.L. No.106-554, 114 Stat. 2763A-153 (2000), hereinafter referred to as the “Information Quality Act.” Your complaint requests correction to information that appears on the FDA Web Site regarding vacuum-assisted wound closure.

FDA’s data quality guidance, which is part of the Department of Health and Human Services Guidelines for Ensuring the Quality of Information Disseminated to the Public, states that FDA will respond to a data quality complaint within 60 days, either by issuing a decision or by providing you with an estimated decision date.

We have not yet completed our response to your complaint because of other agency priorities and the need to coordinate agency review of the response. We anticipate providing you with a response within 60 days from the date of this letter.
