## “Big Buckets” of Research Recommendations

### **Research methodology ---new ways of doing research including:**

- (1) strategies for including stakeholders as research partners
- (2) new methodologies for developing and evaluating programs including pragmatic trials, multi-site trials, long-term trials, population-based approaches, use of technologies
- (3) new measures reflecting outcomes of importance to individuals living with dementia, families, service providers, payors, and health and human service professionals
- (4) longitudinal and population-based studies

### **Development, evaluation of clinically meaningful approaches, strategies, programs addressing:**

- (1) clinical features of dementia and their combination with co-morbidities
- (2) if and how care, services, supports may slow disease progression – what effects they may have on biological processes
- (3) combination of pharma and nonpharma strategies to boost impacts
- (4) adaptation of caregiver support programs for different linguistic, cultural groups
- (5) care strategies for persons living alone

### **Development, evaluation of comprehensive dementia care that is person and family-centered, combining social-medical models and spans disease continuum/etiologies and addressing person-family needs**

- (1) different delivery mechanisms (telehealth, other technologies)
- (2) enhancement of workforce
- (3) cost/simulation models
- (4) flexible menus of services
- (5) creating/evaluating multi-tier low to high intensity/high touch comprehensive care

### **Scaling, disseminating evidence drawing upon implementation science**

- (1) strategies for moving evidence out; using technologies

**These buckets are relevant across settings, disease type and stages, race/ethnicity, cultures, genders**
