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

Potential Prioritization Criteria

- · Outcome measures should be a priority
 - i.e. patient-reported
 - Patient/caregiver experience of care
- Account for minority groups disproportionally affected by ADRD
- Consider patients who do not have a caregiver
- How to approach "patient-reported" measures when people can no longer speak for themselves



National Alzheimer's Plan Listening Session
