

## ADVISORY COUNCIL MEETING ANNOUNCEMENT

The next meeting of the Advisory Council on Alzheimer's Research, Care, and Services will be held on July 20, 2020 from 1:00pm to 5:00pm EST. The meeting, due to COVID-19, will be webcast at <http://www.hhs.gov/live> with public comments.

During the July 20 meeting, an invited panel will present on emergency preparedness for people with dementia with a special focus on the COVID-19 pandemic. The chairs of the subcommittees (Research, Clinical Care, and Long-Term Services and Supports) will present recommendations for adoption by the full Advisory Council.

**Public Input:** Time will be allocated on the agenda to hear public comments from 4:00pm to 4:30pm. The time for oral comments will be limited to two (2) minutes per individual. Registered commenters will receive both a dial-in number and a link to choose from to join the meeting virtually.

If you miss your name and allotted time to speak, you may not be able to make your public comment.
